

## Diplôme d' Etudes en Langue Française JUNIOR ( Delf Junior )

The DELF Junior is recognised Europe-wide as official proof of level and competency in French. It is the official gateway to many French universities.

Each examination evaluates the four skills: listening, reading, speaking and writing.

There is no entry test. Each examination is independent: you can choose the unit that is most suited to your abilities (no need to sit all the levels one by one) When you pass, you receive a diploma to certify to your level. This diploma, unlike many other certificates, is valid for life.

### FAQ

#### 1. Is there an equivalence in level with the New Zealand NCEA

There is no direct equivalence between NCEA and DELF Junior examinations, as the tests themselves are very different.

The DELF Junior examination focuses on immediately transferable skills,

enabling language learners to use and re-use structures and expressions of everyday life in a French environment. As for the general level of difficulty and skill, A1 and A2 are closer to a NCEA Level 1& 2, and B1 and B2 to a NCEA Level 3

#### 2. Is there a difference with the DELF Tous Publics for adults?

The levels and requirements of the DELF Junior are exactly the same as those for the DELF Tous Publics. The difference lies in the choice of topics, which are selected to suit the interests of young people, thus making learning French more fun.

#### 3. Can I use it to enroll at university?

French Universities recognize the DELF B2 as an acceptable qualification for admission to many of their courses. Some of the Universities require a DALF C1 level (available with the "Tous Publics" examinations), however the majority will consider a DELF B2 as sufficient.

#### 4. What can I do after the DELF B2?

Students who have passed the DELF B2 can move on to the DALF C1. Although no longer part of the Junior scheme, the DALF C1 is the normal follow-up to the DELF B2 for A-Level students eager to complete their qualifications before enrolling at university.

## DELFL Junior exams

Based on the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, the Diplôme d'Etudes en Langue Française (DELF) are awarded by the French Ministry of Education. They are the only official French language proficiency qualifications.

As of 2005, a "Junior" version of the DELF, aimed at teenagers, was created to respond to a growing interest in French language proficiency qualifications that would go beyond NCEA

### How to register:

1. Fill in the Registration Form
2. Hand it together with **Full payment** to the registration desk (we accept cash, cheque or Eftpos) or mail it with a cheque payable to Alliance Française.
3. Booking is not confirmed until registration and payment are completed.
4. The deadline for enrolment is **two weeks** prior to the examination
